HEARING THE VOICE OF GOD

“HE WHO HAS EARS, LET HIM HEAR”

I have been reminded this week of the value of living life to its fullest. Our dear friend, brother in the LORD and deacon at the MoSt church, Rufus Organ, passed from this world on Tuesday, February 20. It seems only a short time ago that Rufus was busy working and serving our church and community. I would have to say Rufus was the kind of man that wasn't into wasting a day of his life doing nothing. There is certainly an emptiness we all feel with his passing.

The Bible teaches us that our days are short here on earth! As James says, "You do not even know what will happen tomorrow. What is life? You are a mist, a vapor that appears for a little while and then vanishes," (James 4:14). The Psalmist writes, "The length of our days is seventy years—or eighty if we have the strength; yet they are span of trouble and sorrow, for they quickly pass, and we fly away... teach us to number our days aright, that we may gain a heart of wisdom," (Psalm 90:10,12). 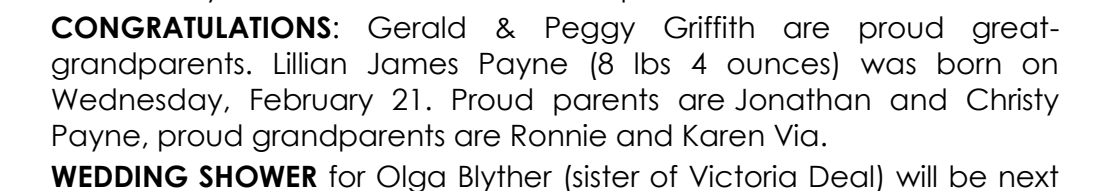
